Frequently Asked Questions

(1) I'd like to bring my RV to Roadhog Park for a football game. How does that work?

A---Roadhog Park has a flat, gravel lot where non-Roadhog Members may park on football game weeks for \$150.00 for the week. It's a first-come-first-served lot until the lot is full and we no longer have room. You can get water when you get here, and we have four dump stations which you can utilize, but there is no electricity or other utilities. We can traditionally handle all who come, with the exception of "big games", such as Alabama and LSU. Our lot holds roughly 85-100 RVs.

(2) Can I run my generator?

A---Motorhomes may run generators if they have a "generator stack" or "Venturi tube", which exhausts fumes above the RV. Trailers are parked around the outer edges, and may run external generators as long as they can be placed behind the RV so as to control noise and fumes.

(3) Can I bring a tow car, and, can I have friends over to tailgate?

A---Yes, each RV may have one car on the lot in addition to his RV. You can have visitors, but they cannot bring cars to the lot---they must park elsewhere and either be picked up or walk to the park.

(4) I am not a Roadhog member. Can I make reservations for an RV parking space?


A---No. Space is available on a first-come-first basis until all available spaces are filled.

(5) How much does it cost?

A---The cost to park 1 RV and 1 car on the gravel lot is \$150 for all non-members. This rate applies for 1 day and up to 7 days prior to a football game. Additional cars or trailers are not allowed.

(6) Can I park on a site with electricity?

A---No, all electrical sites are exclusive to qualified Roadhog Members during football season.



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(7) Can I leave my RV at Roadhog Park between games?

A---Yes. Members and Non-members may leave their RV on gravel lot between games. Please see answer to question 5 for the cost.

(8) How can I join the Roadhogs?

A--- To join the Roadhogs, one must own an RV, have a Razorback Foundation account in his/her name in which a minimum of \$750.00 is donated each year, and pay an annual \$100 Roadhog membership fee. (9) Once I become a member, can I park on an electrical site?

A---New members are placed on the "waiting list", and if a site holder is not coming for a game, waiting list members are then placed on electrical sites as they become available for game weeks. Waiting list members pay \$12 per night when on an electrical site, and may use the park anytime during the year, except for Bikes, Blues, and Barbeque week or any other scheduled special event. When a waiting list member must stay on the dry-camping lot during football weeks, he/she pays \$26 per week. Outside of football season, there are always plenty of electrical sites for waiting list members and non-members.

(10) Once one is on the waiting list, how long does it take before he/she is assigned an electrical site?

A---It depends upon how many electrical site holders drop out, but traditionally, it takes four to six years to move up to an electrical site. The 2017 one-time site fee is currently nonrefundable \$2,000.
